SUBJECT: Commanders Item of Interest #7: Environmental Policy Statement

1. In accordance with Air Force Instruction (AFI) 32-7001, *Environmental Management*, the 17th Training Wing reaffirms commitment to integrating responsible, cost effective environmental stewardship into all activities, products, and services performed in support of maintaining effective Air Force facilities at Goodfellow Air Force Base. Our specific mission includes training to develop exceptional Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance and Fire Protection Professionals. The scope of this statement includes all organizations including the 17 TRW, the Space Force 533rd Training Squadron Detachment 1, the Army 344th Military Intelligence Battalion, the Army 169th Engineer Battalion, the Navy Center for Information Warfare Training Detachment, the USMC Detachment, the Department of Transportation, the Defense Commissary Agency, the Air Force Exchange Service and M1/Delmar. Environmental concerns for this regional/local area include maintaining Texas' valuable water resources, natural resources, air quality and managing waste materials in a manner that reduces the land disposal burden and promotes recycling/reuse.

2. Goodfellow Air Force Base commits to continual improvement, prevention of pollution, and compliance with applicable legal and policy requirements. In conjunction with the comprehensive recurring self-assessment processes prescribed by the Air Force Inspection System, we will maintain our installation-level Environmental Management System (EMS) as the framework for setting goals and reviewing progress toward environmental objectives and targets, including any required by the Department of Defense, Headquarters Air Force, and/or the Air Force Civil Engineer Center.

3. In accordance with AFI 32-7001, this commitment statement has been reviewed for the current year and approved by the 17 TRW Environmental, Safety and Occupational Health Council. It will be communicated to all persons working for or on behalf of the Wing via email workflow distribution and will be made available to the public via posting on the 17 TRW public website.
