Keeping Families Connected



- Key Spouses are crucial to keeping Air Force families connected
- Social media platforms allow Key Spouses to distribute information to a large group of people in a quick and timely manner
- With social media platforms gaining popularity, Key Spouses have great tools available to share information with Air Force families without the hassle of accommodating multiple schedules in order to host a meeting





Facebook

- The increase of Facebook usage across the Air Force allows Key Spouses to post resources, plan meetings, start discussions, and post photos HOWEVER.....
- OPERATIONAL SECURITY must always be the primary concern anytime you're using Facebook.







Operational Security (OPSEC)

- What is OPSEC?
 - The process of identifying critical information and subsequently analyzing how that information can be pieced together/interpreted for use by the enemy
 - Small pieces of a puzzle that create a "Big Picture"
- Why should I care?
 - Protect you and your family
 - Protect DoD Operations









OPSEC and Facebook

- Posting sensitive information can be detrimental to Airmen safety
- Assume the enemy is reading every single post
- Ensure that information posted on-line has no significant value to the enemy.
- Before opening a squadron FB page, a Group moderator should be selected

A Post is Worth A Thousand Consequences



Importance of Group Moderator

- The Group moderator is responsible for:
 - Sending invitations to spouses to join the page
 - Verifying identities of new people who request to join the page using the personnel roster
 - Educating the group on OPSEC standards
 - Reviewing content posted by others and removing those posts which might compromise squadron and USAF OPSEC





Bad OPSEC Etiquette What Shouldn't Be Posted On-Line

- Daily military activities and capabilities
- Future operations or plans, including deployment information and dates
- Results of operations
- Discussions of areas frequented by service members
- Descriptions of overseas bases
- Details of weapons systems and equipment status
- APO addresses for units
- Geotagging photos





What Can I Say Or Post?

- Pride/support for Unit, service, specialty and service member
- General status of a Unit:
 - "Squadron X is operating out of Southern Afghanistan" as opposed to "Squadron X is operating out of Camp Air Force, just outside of village Y, in Southern Afghanistan
- Photos (without Geotagging)







Key Spouse Social Media Guidance

- Understand and abide by Privacy Act guidelines and OPSEC principles
- Train friends, spouses, and Air Force families on basic OPSEC procedures
- Data aggregation from different sources could reveal sensitive or even classified information
- Request permission before posting Personally Identifiable Information (PII) on-Line







Key Spouse Social Media Guidance




- Limit use of location-based services that reveal your location (Geotagging)
- Group moderator should verify the identity of those requesting access with the personnel roster
- Review information and photos before posting
- Be aware of any public affairs implications of your activities
- Group moderator should remove any post that may compromise OPSEC





• If you are not comfortable posting your personal information on a sign in your front yard for everyone to see.....

THEN DON'T POST IT ON-LINE







SUMMARY

- Social media is widely used by the Air Force to communicate with airmen, Air Force families, and the community
- Key Spouses can use social media platforms to share resources/provide information to squadron spouses
- OPSEC and Privacy Act should be taken into consideration On every social media platform
